







Member Profile



John Huitt (President)

I was born Melbourne August 1946. I grew up in Greensborough, Victoria, a then small rural outer suburb of Melbourne. I attended Greensborough Primary School and went on to Watsonia Tech where I completed Form 2, and left school at age 14. My first job was in my parents' fruit shop in Greensborough for a short time before moving onto

driveway attendant & lube boy at a local service station and also training as a mechanic.

After picking up some mechanical experience, I worked at Value Motors Wrecking Yard at Box Hill, before embarking on a new career in Earthmoving as a Plant Operator.

After being on wages as a plant operator I purchased my own truck and became an owner operator with a F600 Ford Tipper working mainly for the local council. I eventually moved up to, and owner operated a Semi Tipper at the Pioneer Quarry. I had 'Backhoes & Tippers' until 1978 and then moved away from driving, and starting our own business, "Diamond Valley Wreckers" in Briar Hill. Later we added "Greensborough Truck Wreckers" in Para Road Greensborough, and then went onto establish "Victoria Truck & Tractor

Wreckers" in Campbellfield in 1987.Later the business moved to the Hume Hwy at Somerton which was the location and business we retired from in 2019.

I met my wife Thelma in 1963. She was 15 and I was 17. We were married 1968 in Greensborough. We have three sons, one daughter, ages being 53 down to 48, seven grandchildren and one great grandchild.

I purchased my first ever Model T, in 1964, the Snake Gully Fire Brigade T from Broadford for \$20.00. I later sold it for same as it cost me. Sadly, I never did anything with it and wonder where it might be now? My first road car was a 1934 sedan at age 16, and my first registered car was a 1953 Ford Anniversary at age 17. At age 18 I had a 1936 Ford Sedan & many Fords & Customlines followed.

Thelma's' first cars at 17, were an A Model Ford, then aged 18 she had a 1947 Ford Sedan, then a 1936 Ford sedan! As you can see, we have had a long association with the Ford brand.



I have always had a love for Model Ts, but due to money shortage, work & family life commitments. it prohibited my interest from becoming a reality until 2004 when were able to purchase our 1924 Tourer. We now have 4 model Ts.

Our most memorable trip in a Model T was the Ocean to Ocean New York to Seattle in 2019 in our 1927 T Coupe. The Echuca & Warragul International rallies were standouts.

I look forward to continuing enjoying many more rallies with the club in the future. Regards,

Christine and I decided that this rally would be an ideal one to try out our 1915 Roadster for its first run with us, we had owned it for about three years and only done about 20 kms in it, prior to this rally. The rally was to be centred around Maryborough.

Rally check in and registration was from midday Friday at the motel that we were staying at, and we were given our rally bags full of goodies and of course a rally book full of the route details for the runs.

A shakedown run to Carisbrook left the motel at 2.30 P.M. for a short run of 30kms.. This was a good one for us as I hadn't driven this car much and I needed to get used to its differences from my 1921 Tourer. All went well and the instructions were very accurate and intersections all sign posted. Friday night was a good way to get to know people with a good time had by all at the Bull and Mouth hotel, with an area set aside for us. It was our first meal and it set the tone for the rest, really good.

Saturday was to be a run of about 140 kms to Creswick. We set off from the motel and proceeded to the clubrooms of the Maryborough District Historical Vehicle Club for a breakfast of egg and bacon rolls with sausages and plenty of it, tea and coffee as well. the day towing it on a trailer behind our Falcon.








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
